8. Precept:

(ii) Council approved a grant of £250 to Cefn Cribwr Boys and Girls Club subject to a certified copy of the Club's most recent accounts being provided.

10. Village Greens:

The Clerk reported that he would be arranging to meet Mr. Harris for a site visit in the new year.

11. BCBC Town & Community Council Fund:

It was agreed that the Clerk would apply for match funding from the fund in regard of supporting the CAT of Cae Gof Sports Pavilions(s) and pitches subject to a sustainable agreement and formal proposal from The Athletic and Football Clubs.

12. Provision of Post 16 Education Consultation and Learner Travel Consultation:

Members discussed the learner travel consultation in some detail, the post 16 education consultation would be discussed at the January meeting of Council; it was agreed the Clerk would respond on behalf of Council. Members could also respond individually if they wished.

13. Christmas Decorations:

The Clerk reported that there had been difficulties sourcing trees of a suitable quality, these problems being compounded by very poor communication on the part of BCBC with their sub-contractors, Centre Great, with repeated attempts to remedy the situation only making matters worse. The Clerk had needed to intervene directly with the Centre Great to get matters resolved. After Christmas The Clerk will express Council's disappointment at the service received.

Cllr. H. J. David reported that he had been approached by a resident who suggested that sponsorship from the local community might be sort to fund the village Christmas lighting scheme. All Members agreed this idea should be investigated further and Cllr. David agreed to ask the resident for more detail of their proposal.

14. Members Report:

Town & Community Council Forum: Cllr. D. Evans reported that he had recently represented Council at a meeting of the Town and Community Council Forum. Topics which had been discussed included street cleaning and provision of 6th Form Education

Community Events: Cllr. H. J. David reported that several Christmas events would be taking place over the next month which he would be circulating by email in due course.

Pact Meeting: Cllr. H. J. David confirmed the next PACT meeting was scheduled for 5th December at Pyle Life Centre.

Advice Surgery: Cllr. H. J. David reported that he holds a community advice surgery at the Community Centre on the first Saturday of the month.

Homelessness: Cllr. H. J. David reported that a recent BCBC report had indicated a worrying increasing trend in rough sleepers, many of whom have complex needs. BCBC will be increasing its support for homeless people and has already increased its bed capacity for the winter.

Post 16 education provision: Cllr. H. J. David reported that a consultation regarding the provision of post 16 education was now available via the BCBC website.
